

Instructions for applying your wall letters:

Your lettering consist of 3 parts (with the letters facing you)

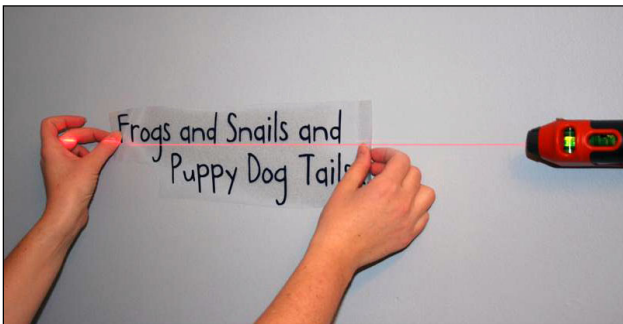
1. Transfer tape
2. Vinyl letters
3. Waxy slick backing

***First make sure that the surface that you will be applying to is clean and dry.**

***Measure and mark with a pencil exactly where you want the lettering to go.**



***Start to peel up the transfer tape. There should be no lettering attached to the waxy slick backing. If there is, lay down the transfer tape gently and start to rub on top of the tape the letters that aren't sticking, and then pull up the transfer tape again. Repeat process until all the letters are attached to the tape.**



***Place the vinyl strip on the wall or object and smooth over the vinyl a few times with a squeegee, popsicle stick, your finger or an end of a credit card to firmly rub all of the letters onto the desired surface. If your walls are textures, you may need to use your fingernail to press letters into the grooves in the wall.**



***Slowly grab one corner of the transfer tape and slowly peel it away at an angle to reveal your lettering. If lettering is not attaching to the surface, firmly rub the lettering again until it attaches.**

***Be careful to get all punctuation and dots for "i" and "j" to adhere to your surface.**

It may take a little more work, time and patience to get your saying to adhere if you are applying a very small or delicate font and/or if you are applying your lettering to a textured or uneven surface. Use your fingers to hold the letters to the surface if they won't release from the transfer tape.

***Vinyl lettering can be taken down by using a hair dryer on high heat. Position hair dryer directly on the lettering and the letters will start to peel up. Use your fingers or tweezers to start lifting it off the wall. Lettering can not be re-used.**
